The Summer Season

After the successful Skipton Waterways Festival (reported in our last newsletter) Kennet has travelled a total of 193 miles through 108 locks and countless swing bridges over the summer. fortunately beating the Leeds & Liverpool Canal closure, but not without some problems.


- Skipton Transport Festival Kennet attended this annual festival in the Coach Street Car Park which adjoins the canal basin after staying in Skipton on the Springs Branch courtesy of Ian & Pam Clarke of Pennine Cruisers for about a month.
- 200th Anniversary of opening of canal in Blackburn/Clayton Kennet was moved from Skipton to Barden Mill over 2 days in preparation for the 200th Anniversary in the Clayton le Moors area in mid June. This saw Kennet travelling from Church to Blackburn

before returning late in the afternoon to Clayton-le-Moors after stopping at Rishton & Church on route.

School Visits – on Kennet's journey to the Leeds Waterways Festival she stopped off in Gargrave and Bradley for visits by Gargrave Primary School and Bradleys Both Primary School as trials to gauge the reaction of both teachers and pupils. These were very successful and gave us

a great insight into the requirements for this type of visit.

Leeds Waterfront Festival – the journey to Leeds proved to be slightly more eventful with a couple of hick ups. Getting stuck in the top gates of Hirst Wood Lock and waiting for water to arrive



- 100th anniversary of the keel Sobriety after Leeds Kennet was moved in one day to the Yorkshire Waterways Museum at Goole with a guest appearance by Geoff Wheat along with his portable VHF set, which proved very useful.
- Buck Wood, Shipley on leaving the Yorkshire
 Waterways Museum Kennet returned to Shipley in 2
 days ready for a successful open afternoon at Buck
 Wood. The first day was marred by an emergency
 stoppage at a lock on the Aire & Calder while BW
 sorted out leaks on the hydraulics controlling the
 sluices. This held us up for 4.5 hours and meant a
 very late evening run into Leeds. Kennet once again
 got stuck going out of Hirst Wood lock!!!



- **Back to Skipton** Kennet has now returned to Skipton and is moored on the Springs Branch prior to visiting the Bradley Family Fun Day which takes place on the Bradley Cricket Field adjacent to the Canal on Sunday September 5th.
- The return to Greenberfield due to the canal closure Kennet will be remaining on the Springs Branch in Skipton until the canal reopens and she can return to her moorings at Greenberfield after a long successful season.
